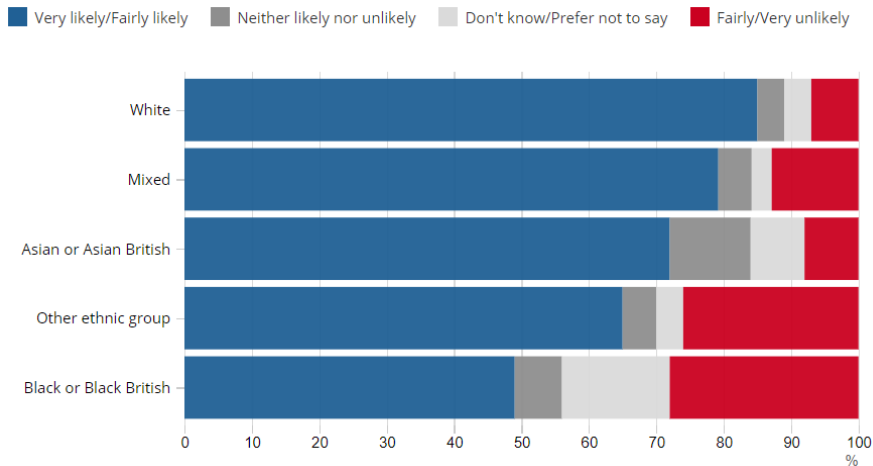


# The likelihood of accepting COVID-19 vaccine is the lowest among Black population

Likelihood of accepting COVID-19 vaccine, by ethnicity, Great Britain, 10 December 2020 to 10 January 2021



- COVID-19 pandemic has exposed significant health inequalities in our society.
- People from Black and Asian backgrounds are more likely to be admitted and die from COVID-19 compared with White population group.
- Yet, people from diverse communities are also more likely to refuse the COVID vaccine.
- Nationwide survey shows that around half (49%) of individuals from the "Black or Black British" ethnic group reported that they would be very or fairly likely to have the COVID-19 vaccine if offered it.
- In comparison, 85% of White respondents said they would take up the vaccine.
