Our website use cookies, to enhance your experience and to improve our website functionalities.

A 'cookie' is a small piece of text file that is stored on your computer when you access certain websites. It collects some information about you such as your IP address, device ID, location, and records how you move around and what you do on the website.

Categories of Cookies

Strictly Necessary: These cookies are absolutely essential for our website to function properly. They ensure basic functionalities and security features of the website, anonymously.

Functional cookies: These cookies help to perform certain functionalities like sharing the content of the website on social media platforms, collect feedbacks, and other third-party features.

Performance cookies: These cookies are used to understand and analyse the key performance indexes of the website which helps in delivering a better user experience for the visitors.

Analytics cookies: These cookies are used to understand how visitors interact with our website. They help provide information on metrics for the number of visitors, bounce rate, traffic source, etc.

Advertisement/Marketing cookies: These cookies are used to gather information about viewing preferences and to provide visitors with relevant ads and marketing campaigns where this is applicable. They track visitors across websites and collect information to provide customised ads for the visitor. Some embedded content, e.g YouTube videos may not be viewable unless advertising cookies are accepted.

Under UK law, we can place strictly necessary or essential cookies onto your device without your consent. However, for all other cookie categories, we will need your consent before we place them on your device.

- 5. delete all cookies when you close your browser
